



East Valley School District Preschool 2009/2010

East Valley School District has several preschool options: ECEAP, I-728, Title I and Special Education. These programs will be available again for the 2009/10 school year. There is no charge for these programs.

Title I preschool- for 4 year olds. An academic needs assessment is a part of the Title I preschool entry criteria. If your child is being considered for this program, you will be contacted with additional information. The Title I preschool is available to students who live in the Trent Elementary and Trentwood Elementary areas; the program is located in Trentwood Elementary.

ECEAP preschool- for 4 year olds. (and 3 year olds, if there is space available) whose families meet low-income level guidelines established by the federal government.** Free early childhood education; well-balanced, nutritious meals; free family assistance and support. ECEAP classrooms are located in Trentwood, Otis Orchards, and East Farms Elementary.

I-728 preschool-for 4 year olds whose families meet low-income level guidelines established by the federal government.** Free half-day preschool program provides early childhood education and pre-kindergarten skills. This program is located at Trentwood and East Farms Elementary.

Special Education Preschool-for students with disabilities. This program is located at Trentwood and Otis Orchards Elementary.
